

The website, theuniversaltypeface.com, represents a united form of imagery which allows interaction of consumers of "BIC" as well as potential consumers to recognize commonalities of handwriting.

How is it interactive?

- Intro video:
 When you first enter the site, a video
 with audio plays which introduces the
- with audio plays which introduces the concept behind the site.
- The central image (authentic handwritten type), automatically scrolls vertically. The user can also scroll using their mouse.
- When your cursor hovers over "EXPLORE", a navigation bar (highlighted in yellow) instantly appears. When it hovers over "CONTRIBUTE" a side bar links you to another page appears.

- Movement of the cursor over the letterforms allows the user to recognize indivual contributions.
- -The user can contribute in real time through their mobile device or through the desktop site. Some users can provide personal information and a photo.

Desktop

- More interactive:
 You have the ability to view the
 different handwritings of many
 people simply by hovering over
 the image.
- When minimizing, the content of the site adapts to a certain extent.
 The content begins to overlap if it is condensed too much.


Mobile

- Limited interaction:
 No hovering ability simply because mobile requires direct contact to the screen.
- There's no landscape mode. You have to view the site upright.

How desktop and mobile connects:

Upon opening the homepage, the "contribute" navigation bar, links the consumer to a page which provides a mobile-specific website and three-digit code. This code allows the user to login through a mobile device to connect and contribute.

Once connected, the user can scribble with the use of their tactile device. Their writing is then reflected onto the main site in real time.





The content overlaps if the window is minimized too much in desktop view.




The content is separated evenly to keep its legibility in the portrait view of the mobile site.







Connecting mobile to desktop is a quick and easy, user-friendly process.

After drawing the letter on the mobile device, the actual drawing will appear on the desktop screen.






The interactivy of contributing to the experiment is also a plus.


Very clean and organized within a grid system. Nice use of color to highlight important components. Effective entrypoint.
